SUMMARY:

The last piece of large equipment the Streets Department needs is a Loader. The current loader is over 15 years old, has major brake issues, and is no longer safe during road construction or other street-related scenarios. The town has worked with Carter CAT through a source well process, a state-sponsored procurement that does not require an RFP, and has received a capital lease agreement with a balloon payment. The lease payments are \$30,000 annually for 60 months with a balloon payment of \$68,800. Utilizing a capital lease allows the town to use the equipment now and incur the final balloon payment in the future.

FINANCIAL IMPACT AND FUNDING SOURCE:

The streets department will cover the first year's payment, and subsequent years' payment as well as the balloon payment will be included in future budgets.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommend accepting the lease and budgeting for future payments.

SUMMARY:

At previous Council meetings, several council members have voiced interest in allowing residential and commercial properties install solar arrays on their property. Currently, there is no statute or ordinance to prevent anyone from doing this, but this ordinance would codify residents' and commercial businesses' ability to do so. Another path to do this would is to include rooftop solar (with a special exception permit) into each zone and have a policy held in Town Hall for what each landowner would need to do to apply for that permit. Staff would like direction from Council on what the best next steps are for this process.

SUMMARY:

The County is providing \$100K of funding for FY 2025 to support Fire Suppression in the Town of Richlands. The County has asked to update the MOU between the County and the Town. The MOU is summarized below.

This amendment, dated May 2024, is between Tazewell County, Virginia and the Town of Richlands, Virginia. It modifies an existing Agreement for Fire Protection and Emergency Medical Services originally signed on June 5, 2007, and previously amended on August 14, 2007.

Key points of the amendment:

- 1. **Purpose**: To maintain and enhance fire protection services for residents in unincorporated areas of Tazewell County's Western and Northwestern Electoral Districts.
- 2. **Service Area**: The Town of Richlands agrees to continue expanded coverage of its Fire Department to serve unincorporated areas of the County, as shown in "Exhibit A" (not provided in the amendment text).

3. Term Extension:

- o The agreement is extended from July 1, 2025 to June 30, 2027.
- It will continue for at least 180 days after June 30, 2027, unless either party gives
 90 days' notice of intent not to renew.

4. Financial Arrangement:

- The County will pay the Town a one-time sum of \$100,000 for capital improvements dedicated to fire protection services.
- Payment is due by August 1, 2024.

AMENDMENT TO AGREEMENT FOR FIRE PROTECTION

This **AMENDMENT TO AGREEMENT FOR FIRE PROTECTION** (hereafter, "the Amendment") is made and entered into this _____ day of May, 2024, by and between TAZEWELL COUNTY, VIRGINIA, a political subdivision of the Commonwealth of Virginia (hereafter, "the County"), and the TOWN OF RICHLANDS, VIRGINIA, a town incorporated pursuant to the Acts of Assembly of the Commonwealth of Virginia (hereafter, "the Town").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the County desires to maintain and enhance fire protection services for residents of the unincorporated areas of the County in portions of the Western and Northwestern Electoral Districts of the County;

WHEREAS, the Town is willing to continue expanded coverage territory of its

Fire Department to enhance fire protection for residents of unincorporated areas of the

County (hereafter, "Service Area"), as shown on the attached "Exhibit A";

WHEREAS, the County and the Town entered into an Agreement for Fire

Protection and Emergency Medical Services (hereafter, "the Agreement") on June 5,
2007, which was amended on August 14, 2007, under which the Town responded to
calls originating from the Service Area outside the corporate limits of the Town;

WHEREAS, both the County and the Town understand and acknowledge that the provision of fire protection coverage for such residents of the unincorporated areas of the County creates significant additional expense for the Town, as compared to the expenses incurred by the Town's providing fire protection coverage solely for persons located within the Town's corporate limits;

WHEREAS, in exchange for the Town agreeing to extend the term of the Agreement to July 30, 2027, which is consideration to the County, the County agrees to pay an additional one-time payment of One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) unto the Town for capital improvements pertaining to fire protection services, which is consideration to the Town;

NOW THEREFORE, pursuant to Section 27-2 of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended, the County and the Town do hereby mutually covenant and agree to amend the *Agreement* as follows:

- The term of the *Agreement* shall be extended from July 1, 2025 and ending June 30, 2027, unless otherwise extended. Further, the *Agreement* shall continue for a period of not less than one hundred eighty (180) days after June 30, 2027, unless either party notifies the other party of its intent to not renew said *Agreement for Fire Protection* for a subsequent term at least ninety (90) days prior to the expiration of the then-current term.
- (\$100,000.00), which sum is specifically designated for capital improvements dedicated to fire protection services. Such payment shall occur by August 1, 2024. Such payment is a one (1)-time payment for capital improvements, which shall constitute payment in full for the term extension above described. The Town shall expend such funds by July 31, 2025.

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improvements dedicated to fire protection services as provided herein, by August 1, 2025. Such accounting shall include, but may not be limited to, invoices, purchase orders, receipts, and any financial history maintained by the Town relating in any matter to said sums for capital improvements dedicated to fire protection services. Any portion of such monies paid pursuant to this Amendment that are not spent for capital improvements dedicated to fire protection services shall be credited toward the County's payments under the Agreement for the subsequent fiscal year.

All other terms of the *Agreement*, and any *Amendments* thereto, shall remain in full force and effect.

The foregoing *Amendment* has been approved by the governing bodies of the County and the Town hereto, and their respective signatures hereunder have been duly authorized thereby.

This document is a resolution (R-2024-08-01) by the Town Council of Richlands, Virginia, prohibiting the placement of yard signs in public rights-of-way. Here's a summary of the key points:

1. Purpose: To maintain the aesthetic appeal, safety, and functionality of public rights-of-way in Richlands.

2. Rationale:

- o Yard signs in public rights-of-way can create visual clutter
- o They can obstruct sightlines for drivers and pedestrians

RESOLUTION R-2024-08-01

A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN OF RICHLANDS PROHIBITING THE PLACEMENT OF YARD SIGNS IN PUBLIC RIGHTS-OF-WAY

WHEREAS, the Town Council of Richlands, Virginia, is committed to maintaining the aesthetic appeal, safety, and functionality of public rights of way in the Town; and

WHEREAS, the proliferation of yard signs in public rights-of-way can create visual clutter, obstruct sightlines for drivers and pedestrians, interfere with maintenance activities, and detract from the overall appearance of the Town; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council of Richlands, Virginia has determined that it is in the best interest of public safety, community aesthetics, and efficient maintenance of public spaces to prohibit the placement of yard signs in public rights-of-way.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Town of Richlands Town Council hereby restricts the ability for any person, organization, or entity to place, install, or maintain any yard sign within any public right-of-way within the Town of Richlands.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that if any yard sign is found in a Town of Richlands right-of-way, then the Town Manager or his designee shall be entitled to remove such sign without having to give notice to the true owner of such sign, and such sign will be held at the Richlands Town Hall for a period of thirty (30) days after such removal for the true owner to claim such sign. Upon the expiration of thirty (30) days, and the sign is still unclaimed, the Town Manager or his designee shall have the ability to dispose of such sign.

TITLE III: ADMINISTRATION CHAPTER 36: CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT ACCOUNTS

CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT ACCOUNTS

Creation of New Ordinance 36.03

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Town of Richlands, Virginia, pursuant to §§2.2(3) and 3.4(2) of the Town Charter, Section 32.45, 32.46, and 32.48 of the Richlands Town Code, and Virginia Code §§15.2-2501 and 15.2-2505, that the Council hereby IMPLEMENTS Section 36.03 of the Town Code regarding a capital improvement account for the Richlands Annex Capital Account:

§36.03 RICHLANDS ANNEX CAPITAL ACCOUNT

- (A) The Town hereby establishes a capital project account for the Richlands Annex project which shall comprise of
 - a. A combined fire station and rescue squad building with four (4) bays for the fire station and three (3) bays for the rescue squad
 - b. A public works building
 - c. A salt container building
 - d. A pole barn store for public works apparatus
 - e. Concrete work for the entire project space
 - f. HVAC systems for all buildings
 - g. Electrical systems for all buildings
 - h. Interior carpentry for all buildings.
- (B) Funding for this account may come from any or all of the following sources:
 - a. Moneys appropriated and made available by the Town
 - b. Grants from state or federal agencies
 - c. Donations or contributions from private individuals or organizations
 - d. Bond proceeds, if applicable
 - e. Any other moneys which may be made available to the Town for the purpose of this project.
- (C) Any money held in this account shall be used solely for the planning, construction, and completion of the Richlands Annex Project. Upon completion of such project, any remaining money held in the account may be further held in this account for maintenance of the Richlands Annex, or transferred to another Capital Improvement Project as deemed appropriate by the Richlands Town Council.
- (D) This account shall have its own line item of the Town's budget starting fiscal year 2025 and each fiscal year thereafter.
- (E) The Town Manager, or his designee, shall provide quarterly reports to the Town Council on the status of the Richlands Annex Project and the balance of this Capital Account.
