Y 2025 Proposed Budget

Single most important document presented to Town Council

Serves Citizens by providing an understanding of the Town's Operating fiscal program

Legal Basis of the budgetary accounting system for the year

Based on historical actuals

Balanced





Property Tax Rate Reduction

- Property Rate for FY 2025 is \$0.19
- Assessments have increased
- Property Tax accounts for only 8% of general fund revenue
- Revenue Structure decreases reliance on citizens
- Pushing for more tourism

Equates to a reduction of \$4 per month for a \$200,000 property owner

Aunicipal Solid Waste See Increase

Proposed increase from \$12.65 to \$15
Fee increase equals new trash truck
Trash Truck financed over five years
New Trash Truck every five years
Keep three trucks ready
Holiday trash route being scheduled –
four-day trash routes



Jtility Rate Adjustments

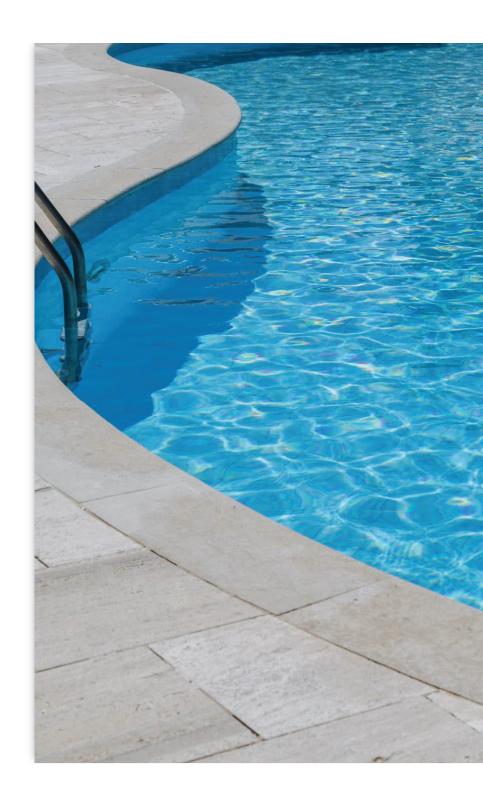
- One dollar increase per 1000 gallons for water rate
 - Equates to \$2.50 increase per month per household utilizing 2500 gallons
- Twenty-five cent increase per 1000 gallons for sewer rat
 - Equates to \$0.65 increase per month per household utilizing 2500 gallons
- One dollar increase to monthly customer charge on Electric bill
 - AEP has increased \$26 per month and has a reques for \$10 more

This rate adjustment increases a family's utility bill by approximately \$4.15 per month per household – an increase is \$6.50 per month per family with the Trash Fee increase included

Proposed Budget Highlights

Rec Park Pool & plashpad

- Start design spring summer of 2024
- Construction begins fall of 2024
- New Pool & Splashpad ready for Memorial Day 2025
- Debt financing Parks & Recreation will pay for debt service
- 5 or 10-year financing
- Debt Service turns into CapX fund once the debt is paid





Fire Station / Rescue Squad Building

- Current station not large enough for apparatus
- Cleared area at Public Works not in the floodplain
- Fire Department is not a VFD nor a municipal Fire Station – issue with grants

Five Percent Cost of Living Adjustment

State provided 4%

Inflation is still an issue

Town's compensation behind the region and county

Recruiting and retention

Large projects on the horizon

- Half funded not hiring until January 1 2025
- Commence a free Fire Inspection Program
- Smoke detector installation
- Better coverage
- First step to full-time crew

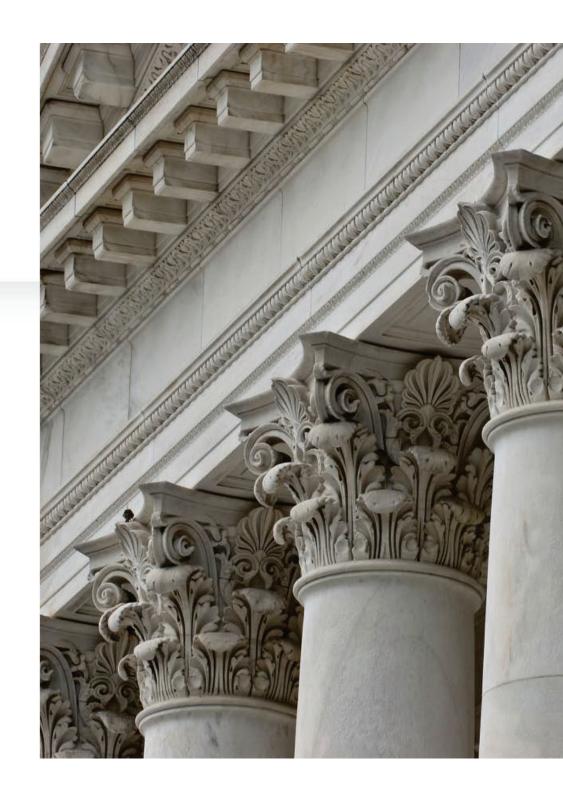
